24/043 Declarations of interest

There were no declarations on agenda items.

24/044 Policing Matters

Cllr. Hunter reported an incident of vandalism that had occurred at The Stirrup Cup recently.

24/045 Barton Seagrave Residents time

Mr Thompson spoke of concerns over speeding vehicles in Manor Road. Cllr. Edwards responded and discussed the possible involvement of Highways but as the Redrow development had yet to be adopted this would be in the future. Cllr. Currall suggested the involvement of the Police with the gathering of data. Regarding speeding in Polwell Lane, following the last meeting, the Clerk had contacted Morrisons and Weetabix. Morrisons said they would draw this issue to the attention of staff but no response had been received from Weetabix.

Mrs Murphy raised the issue of the gate that was erected in Barton Road at Big Spinney and was concerned that this may be removed.

Cllr. Edwards is to speak to Highways over the provision of temporary "No parking on verge" signs. **Action: SE**

Cllr. Skinner asked if verge posts could be provided if the Parish Council funded them. Cllr. Edwards is to check with Highways. **Action: SE**
